International Women's Month: "Be Bold for Change"

On Tuesday March 8th, women all over the world will host events that remind us of the struggle that still continues to this day. Earlier this year we saw a revival of the movement when women around the world protested after the inauguration of President Donald Trump. On Tuesday, we will celebrate the many milestones that we have overcome. We will celebrate the victories that were a result of our strong faith and courageous acts.

I wonder how many reading this even know that Wednesday is a special day. A day when we celebrate women around the world who did something courageous to change the course of time and give women the opportunities to become lawyers, doctors and the right to vote. Yes, women's voices were heard recently as they boldly declared that things were unfolding in what they believed was pushing us backward instead of driving us forward.

It is a bold act to stand and declare the laws unfair when you are in the minority but that is what women have been doing for centuries.

The fight for equality began way before that. This recent uprising of women's rights reminded me that the women's rights movement did not begin in the eighteenth century. Women's rights began in the book of Numbers chapter 27th when the five daughters of Zelophehad, Mahla, Noa, Hoglah, Milcah, and Tirzah, made a bold step forward for change, went to Moses and stated their case. They laid out the law as it was, but they also made Moses aware that their father did not sin in rebellion against Korah, therefore they believed their case was unique and should be examined.

Moses listened and then he took the case to God, the judge of all the earth, and the bible tells us in Gen.18:25 that the judge of all the earth will do right. Moses took the case to God and in Numbers 27:7 God answered: "The daughters of Zelophehad speak what is right, you shall surely give them a possession of inheritance among their father's brothers, and cause the inheritance of their father to pass to them."

What a powerful statement straight from God on their behalf. Can you imagine standing in court making your claim and the local judge is powerless to help, but then your case is brought to the supreme court the highest court in the land and the Attorney General speaks out on your behalf and says "Give her what she asks for." This should be a great reminder to all of us that even when the odds are against us, even when the law says one thing, when it is taken to God he has the last word. It reminds me of the movie "The Great Debaters" when Denzel Washington (Mr. Tolson) was training the students at Wiley College to be the best debaters, he took them out on a river in a boat and asked them over and over:

- Q Who's the judge?
- A. The judge is God
- Q. Why is He God?
- A. Because it is He who determines who wins and who loses not our opponent
- Q Who is your opponent?
- A. He does not exist\
- Q. Why does he not exist?
- A. Because he is a mere dissenting voice of the truth that speaks.

Tolson knew that getting the students to repeat this several times would cement it in their brains and each time they were tempted to be discourage his words would echo in their ears and their faith would ignite and give them a fresh wind of inspiration and motivation.

The word of God teaches us that "Jesus is the way the truth and the life" Regardless of the challenges you are facing remember that God is the judge of all the earth and He will always do right. Even if He has to change all the laws of the land to make it happen. You are His child and His love for you far out weighs any law, any boss, any spouse that seek to destroy you and rob you of your rights, any child that dishonours you. God is on your side and when the time comes for you to stand up and be Bold for change, don't hesitate, you stand up knowing that you do not stand alone.

These five courageous women began a woman's rights movement which probably gave modern day women the idea and courage to start something that would change the course of history and give women the rights to become lawyers and doctors, the right to vote and an opportunity to become anything that they wanted to be in the professional field. This bold act preceded the church leaders that would later draft rules that would prevent women from being ordained as pastors and leaders. But, while they were drafting the laws, the judge of the earth was making a declaration on women's behalf and today we have the freedom to stand up and be counted. The rights that became theirs are now ours and we have our inheritance. It is an inheritance that Paul wrote about in the book of Ephesians 1:18 "I pray that the eyes of your understanding may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in His holy people."

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The five daughters of Zelophehad was determined not to lose their inheritance, they argued their case so convincingly to Moses that Moses became sympathetic to them and decided to take their case to the highest court of Law where only God presided.

That was not the end. After Moses died and they entered the promised land under the leadership of Joshua, when the inheritance was being distributed there was none for these five sisters and Moses was not there to remind the leaders that they were entitled to their father's inheritance. So, these women who thought everything was settled had to plead their case one more time. Ladies, it may take more than one try, but just know that justice will be served and you will receive your inheritance if you take that bold step forward for change. As you forge forward into your future be comforted knowing that there is someone greater who you can always depend on. Let Him guide you, Let Him lead you and everything will be alright.

Aunty Bea, for Beatrice, is a devoted Christian who preached Christ to everyone including my sisters, my brothers, her sisters, her daughters, and even backsliders; she once said to my cousin, "What are you waiting on to return to Christ? Don't you know he is married to the backslider?" As a matter of fact, she preached this to the entire district.

I did occasionally wonder about how things were created and about why the sky is blue and where was heaven. I used to sit for hours staring up at the sky looking for God; the results were fragmented pieces of clouds forming distinct and indistinct creatures and objects. I went on the train track once and saw limestones ballast and felt they were something valuable, because of the sun's glare ricocheting off the rocks illuminating a sharp, glistening light, a temporary feeling of being rich. I was also puzzled about the rails on the track; I couldn't fathom how they ended up there let alone made.

However, my realization of God began when Aunty Bea did not include me in God's fold, as, I, in retrospect, must have been too young to be considered. I was overlooked, like David whose father was blinded by David's youth. This time, however, it wasn't a prophet asking my mother to anoint her youngest daughter. I was the one advocating for myself. This moment was the trigger, a spark, the moment that led me to pray, to find out from the main source why he didn't want me in his fold.

Prayer was our daily, and nightly nursery rhymes sang to calm the heat of oppressive forces at nights that led my mother to burn frankincense and myrrh, said to ward off evil, but first, throwing me a pillowcase to tie my head to reverence the Most High, before reading Psalms 91. Prayer was the cheerful chants of "Gentle Jesus, meek and mild look upon this little child," cheered by a distant relative we called Uncle who held our hands and clapped while singing with us, so I knelt and asked God why. My answer wasn't a vision neither was it a thundering voice from heaven. It came probably months later when my cousins invited me to go with them to a nightly crusade. It was here that I held up my hand after the preacher preached. Of course, there were the constant jeers of, "I give you one week." "Kathy, yu? Yu soon hear the music and yu fi get bout church." I didn't get a chance to hear the music, however. The Holy Ghost came the next day, my second baptism. People from near and far came to witness, and for some, it was nonsense-Satan was jealous- and for others, it was a total conviction of the heart. Some got saved, and some got revitalized.





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This moment marked the beginning of my realisation of God's power and the fulfilment of his word: "Whosoever will may come."
