l got up early one morning and rushed into the day: l had so much to accomplish that l didn't have time to pray.



SURVIVAL TIPS FOR DURING THE BUSY HOLIDAY SEASON



Remember: Jesus is the reason for the season With Christmas approaching, we often say that Jesus is the reason for the season, but many of us still find ourselves wondering how we are going to get through the 12 days of Christmas along with the long list of commitments.

Here are a few practical tips that I hope you can use:

1. Set your priorities. Before too many activities overwhelm you, it's important to decide which traditions offer the most positive impact, and eliminate unnecessary activities. For example, if you usually become overwhelmed by a flurry of baking, shopping, sending cards, visiting relatives and other activities that leave you exhausted, you may want to pick your favourite activities and really enjoy them, and skip the rest.

2. Ask for help. Have a "family meeting" and make a commitment to share tasks. Rather than have one person cooking the whole meal, have family and friends bring a dish. Children can help with gift-wrapping, decorating, baking or addressing cards. Try to focus on doing what's really important to you and your family.

3. Beware of overindulgence. Alcohol is a depressant so try to keep consumption to a minimum. Too much food can make you feel lethargic, tired and even less able to keep up a busy pace.

4. Relax...Breathe...Enjoy! This sounds so simple, but sometimes we forget to take deep breaths and give our bodies the oxygen we need. Remember to take time to do things you enjoy like exercising, listening to music or meditation that will serve as much-needed breaks during the hectic weeks of the holidays.

5. Stay within budget. Finances are a great stressor so set a budget and stick with it. A call, a visit or a note to tell someone how important he or she is to you can be as touching and often more meaningful than a gift.

6. Remember what the holiday season means to you. While holiday advertising creates a picture that the holidays are about shiny new toys and gift giving, remember that this season is really about sharing and time spent with loved ones. Develop your own meaningful family traditions. Encourage children to make gifts or cards for friends and relatives so the focus is on giving rather than receiving.

7. Learn about others. Attend diverse cultural events with family and friends. Help out at a local food bank or donate clothing and toys to families in need so that they can enjoy a happy holiday season. It's a good feeling to give to others.

8. Include others. If you have few family members or close friends nearby, reach out to neighbours. Find ways to spend the holidays with other people. If you're part of a family gathering, invite someone you know is alone to your gathering.

9. Put fun, humour, affection and "break time" into your holidays. Fun or silly activities, games or movies that make you laugh, hugs, playing with pets, and quiet time alone or with a partner are all good ways to reduce stress.

10. Get into the light. Research suggests that elevated depression around this time of year can have a lot to do with the weather, especially lack of daylight and Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD). So soak up the sun when you can. If your dampened mood persists for weeks into the New Year, consider a visit to your physician or mental health professional.

Christmas Cake!

Here's what you'll need to make a yummy Christmas Cake

- 1 lb butter or margarine .
- 1 dozen eggs.
- 4 cups brown sugar
- 5 cups flour
- 2.5 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon allspice

5cups mixed and or finely cut fruits

- 2 cups red wine(sweet)
- 1 cup rum
- 1/2 cup molasses.





Fruits should be pre-soak in rum and wine, if not boil fruit with the wine and rum on low heat for $10\ to\ 15\ minutes.$ Let cool.


Cream sugar and butter, add eggs one at a time until mixture is smooth , add vanilla, add cool fruit mixture .

Combine flour, salt, allspice and baking powder cinnamon and add to mixture slowly and well. mixture should be slightly runny, if mixture is too runny add more flour, if its too dry add more wine

Pour mixture into well greased and floured baking pan, bake for 1 hour at 350 degrees.

To test if cake is done insert tooth pick, if tooth pick come out clean cake is done.

When done pour a little wine or rum over warm cake, you can also uesd warm water . Happy baking.



IN THE SPIRIT OF GIVING

I must confess giving wasn't inherently something I did. I frowned upon the idea of giving a piece of my spit-laden gum, as a child, a common practice on the island of Jamaica, even a taste of bag juice, when my cousin said "beg yu some nuh," but best of all was the ice cream man's pious arrival. Every Sunday evening, he came on his scooter with the tune of "Cree-EE-my here." Children rushed to their gates in much anticipation. Don't even think about asking for some if you were one of the unfortunate ones. Giving can be difficult because it requires a sacrifice. It takes much time, effort, and discipline to reach one's goal, saving allowances or lunch money, especially with limited cash flow. I too was guilty of a similar act. My mother scolded me once because I refused to give some of my hair oil to my sister. After months of saving up every penny, I finally reached my goal. With pride and joy, I purchased my first plastic jar of Magic green hair oil, and the first person to sample it was my sister. How could this be? When I found out she took some, I threw the jar away. In retrospect, it wasn't the desire of longer hair, which would have been most welcome, as was the norm, but that's another tale for another time; however, it was more so crossing the threshold into adulthood. As a girl, this was my rite of passage. I accomplished something that was common to my mother, independence.

My mother was a higgler- seller- initially, in Spanish Town market, and then in Manchester market. I heard she even went to Chapleton, and some other places around the island to sell. If she were alive now, she would have been considered an entrepreneur. She wasn't afraid to spread her wings and soar. She sold chicken feet. She had a much needed heightened sense of determination, nine children and social and religious onslaught. There was an overwhelming feeling of my womanhood being robbed, one that I held so dearly.

Of course, this lesson wasn't clear in the heat of the moment, as a child. It was not until I looked back through the eyes of my experiences and, more importantly, positioned my action in the word of God that I came to fathom the errors of my ways.

"Oh Lord, You're beautiful. Your face is all I seek. For when Your eyes are on this child, your grace abounds to me" The Bible says, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Christ is the reason for the season. Now, sometimes as believers our understanding resulting to actions becomes "vain oblations" in God's sight; we regurgitate scriptures through rote. Consequently, they become religious like the children of Israel's, chanting without actions, meaninglessness, resulting to misunderstandings and misdeeds, and God said to bring no more of these robotic mechanical worship; away with them. He said to write his word on our hearts, not literally but metaphorically. The word becomes life, our choices and actions done with love. We need to know that understanding results to action whether good or bad. If bad, they become dead, dry bones, infertile because they are missing the key ingredient, love. Christ said, "Every tree that brings not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire."

We should not overlook the descriptor good. My fruit wasn't good. It became vain because of my selfish action. Consequently, it was not acceptable to my mother, and now I know that my mother's heart was saturated with God's love. She understood what true worship is. However, I adopted the principles and ethics of hard work from my mother, resulting in my fruit, my Magic green hair oil, but not the understanding of love. I wasn't willing to extend a hand or stretch myself. I was missing the key ingredient, love. Now, not to say that my mother wasn't a giver and that was what resulted in my behaviour; this wasn't so; otherwise, she wouldn't have corrected my behaviour.

According to one of my sisters, our house was like a hotel; people kept passing through. My mother extended her hands widely and wisely. Ultimately, I chose not to give. Some would say, well that's a kind gesture, but giving is a gift. I beg to differ. Salvation is a gift, and it is our choice to accept it fully. My mother was proud of me, but she knew I missed the mark, love. God wasn't selfish in his decision; he loves humanity so much that he gave His only begotten Son, Christ, to redeem us so that we can eat from the tree of life. He requires offering up our prized possessions. He calls us not only to produce fruit but to produce good fruit, not to be selfish in our decisions but to be true in our actions. I must say I admire my mother's courage. It took real courage to discipline a child after such achievement, one that was probably frowned upon then and would have been frowned upon now. But God requires a sacrifice. Let's not miss the mark.
