Soon by God's Grace and power done through Elisha the prophet, she was able to receive an abundant of oil so much so she had to borrow many containers to fill them with oil.


God fill them all,and so it is with the blood of Jesus.His death on the cross pour forgiveness into as many hearts as will open unto him to filled with the Holy Spirit.
